EPA RANKING POINTS AWARDED TO COUNTY PLAYERS

Ranking points will be awarded to County players playing Inter-County Pool

Forming a County Association Ranking List. Regional Ranking List.

National Ranking List.

The Top 7 Men, Top 7 Ladies, Top 7 Seniors & Top 7 Juniors, Top 7 (Available)

from each Region's Ranking Point lists will gain a place in the EPA Team Trials.

These will be run to the current Swiss system over a weekend event.

RULES

- 1. Each County Associations match Official will collate their Inter-County result sheets at the end of each match.
- 2. Each Result Sheet must be filled out by the Captain and contain the player's full first name and surname. (2005 AGM).
- 3. The home County Secretary or County Official to submit the match score on the day of the match taking place.
- 4. Match sheets to be in the hands of the Regional results collator within six days of the match taking place.
- 5. The Regional results collator will enter these results onto the online computer system to form a Regional Ranking list.
- 6. Where a Region has more than 10 Inter-County matches during a season, the players ranking points for the year are divided by the number they have played and multiplied by 10 giving the player a mean average of 10 matches. Likewise with a Region with 5 County Associations, they are divided by 8 and multiplied by 10.
- 7. Where play offs are needed to be held in a Region to decide who was attending the Trials, these must be sorted by the percentage rule. Percentage rule not to apply for rest of Regional table.
